You can check out a museum, theater, or café with WPL's culture passes! (first come, first served basis)

Please take the opportunity to enjoy cultural offerings in our area and appreciate the generosity of these business and organizations.

Here's what to do:

Choose a cultural venue from the list. You can see if one is available by looking on the online catalog or by asking library staff. Please note the special terms for each venue.

Any Valley Libraries Connection adult card holder may check out a pass. Only one pass may be checked out at a time with no renewals.

Passes are available on a first come first served basis. Holds may not be placed on passes nor will they be transferred to other libraries in the Valley Libraries Connection.

You must take the date due slip to the venue in order to receive the discount. The pass will not be honored without the date due slip or after the due date. You do not need to return the slip to the library.

Free tour of the Blackfriars Playhouse for up to four people. Expires one week from the checkout date.



Free general admission for a family of four. This does not include admission to special events. Expires one week from the checkout date.

\$3.00 off a café or store purchase. Expires three days from the checkout date.



One free week. Join within the week and get **50% off** the joiner's fee. Expires one week from the checkout date.



Buy one get one ticket for Richard Adams Show, River City Radio Hour, Mojo Saturday Night or Comedy Night **ONLY**. Expires one week after checkout.



One free admission with the purchase of an adult admission. (Offer limited to one free admission per family). Expires one week from the checkout date.
