- ✓ 16 - 21 years old
- ✓ No longer enrolled in school
- ✓ Living in Augusta, Bath, Highland, and Rockbridge counties, or the cities of Buena Vista, Lexington, Staunton or Waynesboro

WHO CAN ANSWER YES TO ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- The family's household income does not exceed Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- The family receives public assistance.
- Has a disability (IEP for example).
- Is living in foster care.
- Is homeless.
