

How to View Your Property's Impervious Area

Impervious surfaces are surfaces like rooftops and parking lots that do not allow rainwater to soak into the ground. Rain water from these surfaces runs off to ditches and underground pipes in the City and is carried to the South River. The City has to maintain this system of pipes and ditches.

The City used a computer mapping program to measure the impervious area at all properties in the City. This information is available for you to view on the City's website. The steps below are meant to help you find this information, but please feel free to call the Stormwater Program if you have questions.

First. Visit the [City's Mapping Website](#) in the web browser on your computer or mobile device.


Second. Read the Disclaimer and click or tap the check box immediately below. *(The information on this site is provided as public information. If you have concerns about the measurement of your property after viewing this information please call us.)*

Third. Click or tap the box labeled 'Enter Site'.

Fourth. Search for your property by Owner Name, the Account Number on your statement, or the House Number and Street Name.

Fifth. Click or tap on your property in the Search Results

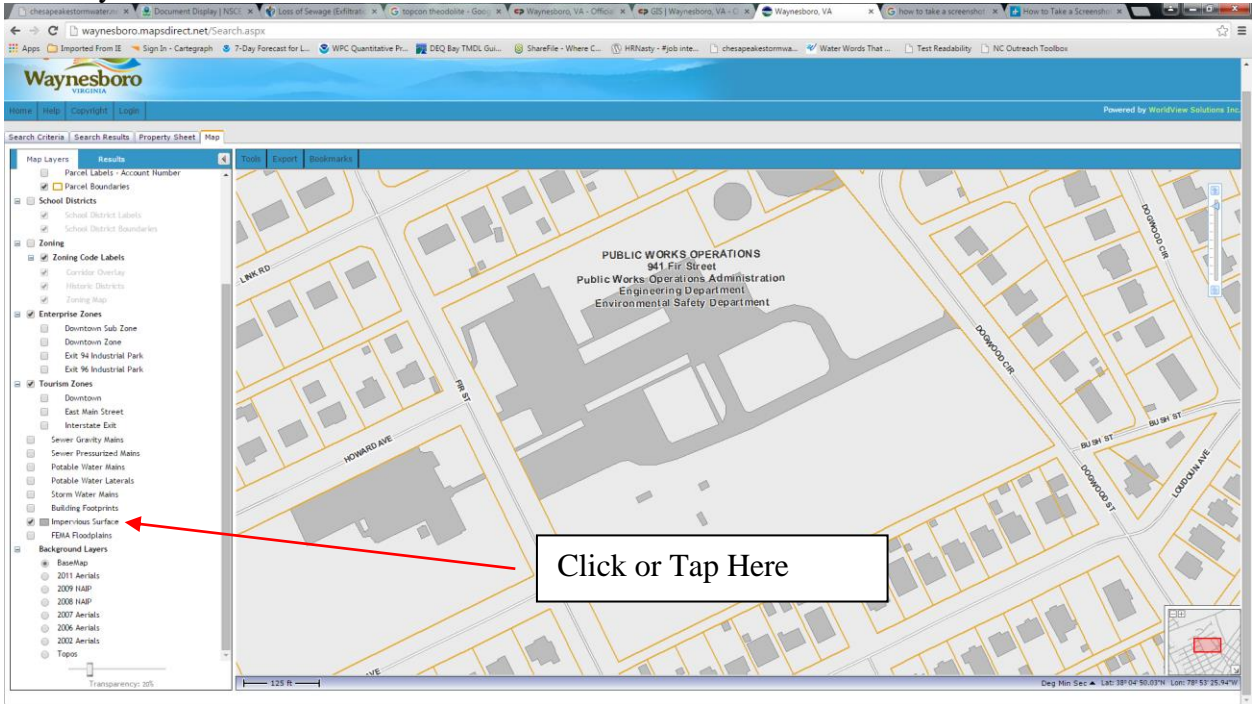
Sixth. This will bring you to the Property Sheet for your property.
