Here's what to do:

Choose a venue from the list. You can see if one is available by looking on the online catalog or by asking library staff. Please note the special terms for each venue.

Any Valley Libraries Connection adult card holder may check out a pass. Only one pass may be checked out at a time with no renewals.

Passes are available on a first come first served basis. Holds may not be placed on passes nor will they be transferred to other libraries in the Valley Libraries Connection.

You must take the date due slip to the venue in order to receive the discount. The pass will not be honored without the date due slip or after the due date. You do not need to return the slip to the library.
