If your leaves are missed or additional leaves have fallen after your area has been completed, please call Public Works Operations at 942-6743 to be included in the final collections list; If crews have completed final collection list, homeowner is responsible for disposal of leaves. Leaf piles may not remain on city right of way. Leaves may be bagged and collected by following bulk collection guidelines or by adding two additional bags per week to regular refuse collection.

Scheduled Leaf Collection Services

The Department of Public Works provides scheduled leaf collection services beginning **the first Monday in December**.

Weather Delays

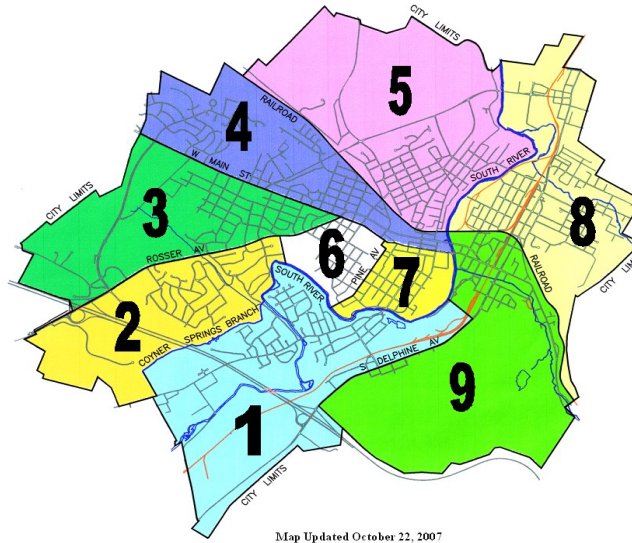
The collection schedule is dependent on weather conditions: we are unable to collect leaves during rain, snow or frost conditions; wet, soggy or frozen leaves can slow down the collection process.

Area Divisions

Leaf collection is divided into areas and will be collected this year in the following order 1 (as shown on map):

Unscheduled Collection begins the first Monday in November

Unscheduled leaf collection is conducted at the discretion of the Street Supervisor and focuses on areas with high concentrations of leaves, narrow streets and little or no placement area for leaf piles. The unscheduled collection concludes prior to the scheduled area collection.

Protecting Grass

Grass is dormant at this time of year and should remain undamaged by these temporary piles if raked out close to scheduled leaf pick up. In addition, the potential safety and drainage problems caused by raking leaves into the street far outweigh the benefits of protecting the grass at the front edge of your property. Unscheduled Leaf Collection begins the first Monday in November and Scheduled Leaf Collection begins first Monday in December.

Leaf Collection Guidelines

- Leaves will not be picked up from alleys;
- **NEVER** rake leaves into the street! Leaves in street can cause serious safety, drainage and ecological problems such as slick pavement, danger to children playing in leaf piles, blocked storm sewers and excess nutrients in the South River if leaves drain in through storm sewers;
- Where no curb exists, leaves should be located along the shoulder near the pavement edge;
- On streets that have curb and gutter, please rake leaves to front edge of property but far enough off the curb so that leaves don't get washed into street;
- Rake leaves between, instead of around, trees near the road;
- Do not rake leaves onto sidewalks;
- Because we recycle our leaves, please do not bag them;
- Do not mix trash, limbs or cut grass with leaves! Mixing creates a problem for the leaf vacuum and poses hidden dangers for pedestrians who may sidestep to avoid traffic;
- Please cover blowing leaves with a tarp and city crews will remove & replace tarp in your yard;
- Citizens who prefer to bag their leaves instead of raking to the front curb may do so by following bulk collection guidelines or by adding two additional bags per week to regular refuse collection.
- **All fallen leaves should be placed out for collection PRIOR to the start of Scheduled Leaf Collection.**
